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4 Whereas: The MPFFU Strategic Plan identified the need to continually monitor
5 the structure of the MPPFU and to look for opportunities to reduce
6 the number of MPFFU district vice presidents and,
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8 Whereas: Reducing the number of District Vice Presidents would not affect
9 services to locals but would reduce the costs associated directly and
10 indirectly with the number of District Vice Presidents, and
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12 Whereas: The MPFFU Executive Board is currently comprised of Six District
13 Vice Presidents that are elected to represent the locals in each
14 district, and the number of locals contained in these districts varies
15 greatly with more than thirty in some districts and as few as 3 in the
16 smallest, and
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18 Whereas: Reducing the number of districts from Six to Five would provide a
19 better balance in the number of locals in each district, and
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21 Whereas: The current First District Vice President is not seeking re-election,
22 therefore creating a vacancy in that position, now therefore be it
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24 Resolved: That effective at this 49th Convention, the locals in the First District
25 and the Third District shall elect one District Vice President who will
26 represent both of these Districts on the MPFFU Executive Board,
27 and be it further

CPI - Per Capita Tax Increase

Whereas: The last per capita tax increase took effect on July 1, 2008, and

Whereas: According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, inflation since July 1, 2008 has decreased the buying power of the per capita tax amount of \$10.25 by fifteen cents (\$0.15), and

Whereas: In order to replace this lost revenue and return it to the January 1, 2009 level, a per capita tax increase is now necessary, therefore be it

Resolved: That the Michigan Professional Fire Fighters Union Constitution and By-Laws be amended to reflect an increase of fifteen cents (\$0.15) cents, effective July 1, 2010, and be it further

Resolved: That the per capita tax amount shall be adjusted annually on July 1st of each year based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics CPI Inflation Calculator found at http://www.bls.gov/data/inflation_calculator.htm

Note: The CPI inflation calculator uses the average Consumer Price Index for a given calendar year. This data represents changes in prices of all goods and services purchased for consumption by urban households.

Per Capita Tax Increase Due to Decrease in Membership

Whereas: The last per capita tax increase took effect on July 1, 2008, and

Whereas: Since that time, the number of MPFFU members that pay per capita tax has decreased by more than 250 members, which equates to a loss of over \$30,000 in per capita tax revenue to the MPFFU, and

Whereas: In order to replace this lost revenue and return it to the July 1, 2008 level, a per capita tax increase is necessary, therefore be it

Resolved: That the Michigan Professional Fire Fighters Union Constitution and By-Laws be amended to reflect an increase of sixty cents (\$0.60), effective July 1, 2010.

Salaries of President and Secretary-Treasurer of the MPFFU

Whereas: The salary of the President and Secretary-Treasurer are currently based on an amount equal to 70% of the salary of the highest paid MPFFU member holding the rank of firefighter and this amount is currently \$48,000/year and is scheduled to increase again on July 1, 2010, and

Whereas: The President and Secretary-Treasurer also currently receive an additional daily compensation payment when they are required to work within the State on Saturday or Sunday, and for each day they are representing the MPFFU at meetings or Conferences outside the State of Michigan and this amount averages approximately \$5,000 per year, and

Whereas: In 2008, the President and Secretary-Treasurer both took a voluntary pay freeze at the rate of \$45,200 due to budgetary concerns, and

Whereas: After a through review, the MPFFU Ad-Hoc Compensation Review Committee has recommended that the payment of MPFFU Principal Officers be revised, therefore be it

Resolved: That the Michigan Professional Fire Fighters Union Constitution and By-Laws be amended to reflect the following changes:

1. The salary for the President and the Secretary-Treasurer of the MPFFU shall be \$48,000 per year.
2. No additional daily compensation shall be paid to the President or Secretary-Treasurer of the MPFFU.
3. No loss of time from work shall be paid to the President or Secretary-Treasurer of the MPFFU.

1. The Daily Compensation rate shall be \$200 per day.
2. No loss of time for work shall be paid to any member of the MPFFU.

Recommendations of the Ad-Hoc Compensation Review Committee

Whereas: The Ad-Hoc Compensation Review Committee conducted a through review of the all compensation items listed in the MPFFU Constitution and By-Laws and after this review they made the following recommended changes:

Resolved: That the following changes be made to the MPFFU Constitution and By-Laws:

1. District Vice Presidents shall receive daily compensation payments for any function approved in advance by the MPFFU President.
2. District Vice Presidents shall only be approved to attend one district meeting outside his/her own district per calendar year.
3. No daily compensation payment shall be made for any of the following activities: Installation of officers or members of a Local (other than a new local), attendance at social or charitable functions of a local, attendance at award presentations or ceremonial functions, attendance at retirement or funeral ceremonies, and providing service to the Vice Presidents own local.
4. MPFFU Trustees shall receive daily compensation payments for two days per year to conduct the MPFFU audits, district meetings in their own Trustee region, attendance at executive board meetings and conventions, and any other function approved in advance by the MPFFU President.
5. MPFFU members serving as instructors at MPFFU Seminars and Conferences shall receive the recognized Daily Compensation Payment for each day that they instruct.
6. Chairpersons of MPFFU Committees shall receive the recognized Daily Compensation rate for each committee meeting.
7. Members requested by the MPFFU President to represent the MPFFU at any function shall receive the recognized Daily Compensation rate.

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8. Mileage or travel reimbursement will no longer be paid to any Emeritus, Lifetime Members or former MPFFU officers invited to the MPFFU Convention.

9. When it is necessary to incur air travel expenses to conduct authorized business of the MPFFU, members shall purchase coach tickets at the best available rate for the days that travel would normally occur for the designated business.

10. The current practice of District Vice Presidents receiving daily compensation for two administrative days per month should be contingent on submission of a detailed written report at each quarterly Executive Board meeting. The DVP shall be required to contact each local in the district at least once per quarter. The report shall list the date the local was contacted, the officer spoken to, and the most current information on each local.

3 **Modification of Convention Delegate Count Structure**
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5 Whereas: Delegate action at the MPFFU 2006 convention changed Detroit Local
6 344's per capita to help solve the local's financial difficulties at the time
7 by reducing payment on five hundred (500) members to four hundred-
8 one (401) members. This convention action also changed the local's
9 Convention delegate count from ten (10) to seven (7). No other
10 adjustment in Convention delegate count was considered at the 2006
11 MPFFU Convention, and;

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13 Whereas: A closer study of Convention delegate count structure reveals a skewed,
14 unfair distribution of Convention delegates, particularly for those local
15 with more than fifty (50) members, and;

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17 Whereas: The fact that seventy (70) of the one hundred twenty-seven (127) MPFFU
18 locals have less than twenty-five (25) members makes it important to
19 retain their current delegate strength in the current system that
20 empowers the MPFFU's smaller locals at Convention (rather than one
21 vote per member like the IAFF system), and;

22
23 Whereas: The current breakdown of MPFFU Convention delegate count is as
24 follows, and:

26	25 members or less entitled to Two delegates	(70 locals)
27	26 – 100 members entitled to Three delegates	(50 locals)
28	101 – 200 members entitled to Four delegates	(4 locals)
29	201 – 300 members entitled to Five delegates	(2 locals)

21 address the collective concerns of its membership, therefore be it

23 Resolved: That the Michigan Professional Fire Fighters Union create a standing
24 committee to address the issues of shared services agreements,
25 including but not limited to, mergers, consolidations, fire authorities,
26 automatic and mutual aid, and be it further
27

28 Resolved: That members of said committee shall gather information, review
29 shared service agreements already created, review attempts made
30 throughout the state and IAFF affiliates regarding shared services,
31 review all state and federal law involving shared services, and be it
32 further
33

34 Resolved: That said committee work with the MPFFU Executive Board and
35 existing standing committees to understand the risks and benefits of
36 shared services agreements and make the necessary
37 recommendations to ensure the protection and long term success of
38 the MPFFU membership, and be it further

Whereas: Most IAFF locals nominate candidates at a meeting weeks or months before the vote giving candidates time to campaign, and

Whereas: The IAFF even nominates District Vice Presidents at the District Caucuses well before the election, and

Whereas: Giving candidates one day to campaign, during our Convention, for these important positions is not adequate, and

Whereas: This addition to the election process would level the playing field for all candidates and give full disclosure, therefore be it

Resolved: That candidates seeking District Vice President must announce their candidacy no later than at their District Meeting, and be it further

Resolved: That candidates seeking Trustee must announce their candidacy no later than at both of the District Meetings affected, and be it further

Resolved: That candidates seeking to be a Principle Officer must announce their candidacy in writing to the MPFFU Office at least sixty (60) days preceding the Convention, and be it finally

Resolved: That no nomination at Convention will be accepted by the Chair if the nominee has not followed the rules set forth in this resolution unless accepted by the floor with a 2/3 vote.

6 Coordination Committee (EMSCC) recommended for law
7 enforcement agencies licensed as medical first responders to
8 have certain medical equipment exceptions and create a separate
9 law enforcement vehicle equipment list, and

11 Whereas: Decreasing the medical equipment requirements required for law
12 enforcement agencies licensed as medical first responders will
13 decrease the level of care provided to citizens, and
14

15 Whereas: Many Michigan Professional Firefighter Union locals are facing the
16 threat of different forms of fire/police consolidation, and
17

18 Whereas: Allowing law enforcement agencies to carry less medical
19 equipment will more easily allow local governments to transfer
20 primary first responder duties from fire departments to law
21 enforcement, therefore be it
22

23 Resolved: That the delegates at this 49th Biennial Convention of the Michigan
24 Professional Firefighters Union go on record as opposing the
25 recent action taken by the EMSCC that would change the
26 equipment list for law enforcement agencies responding as
27 medical first responders in their jurisdiction, and be it further

29 Resolved: That the elected representatives of the MPFFU communicate our
30 opposition to all appropriate agencies and legislative bodies, and
31 be it finally
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33 Resolved: That all MPFFU locals shall urge their Fire Chief to write a letter to
34 the EMSCC stating their opposition to this proposed change.
