Whereas: A firefighter that decides to run for office usually expects the support and of other firefighters through financial assistance and/or endorsements

Whereas: In order to provide a clear understanding of the MPFFU Candidate candidates should be adopted, therefore be it: MPFFU members, written guidelines for endorsement of fire fighter followed when one or more of the candidates are current or former Endorsement Process, and to make sure the process is consistently

Whereas: The last salary increase for IAFF DVP positions, other than COLA

adjustments, was in 2006, and

Whereas: The current annual salary of IAFF DVP positions is \$79,000, and
