

House Analysis: Republicans will maintain control of the Michigan House of Representatives by a 58-52 margin in 2021, a net change of zero (0) seats. Two (2) Democratic incumbents, Rep. Sheryl Kennedy (D-Davison) and Rep. Brian Elder (D-Bay City) lost, but Democrats picked up two (2) open Republican seats. This is the sixth straight election that the GOP has won the Michigan House. Shifting demographics allowed Democrats to pick up the two (2) seats in Kalamazoo County and southern Oakland County, but those shifting demographics also weakened their base in Bay City and outer Genesee County. Republicans maintained their hold on many contested Oakland County seats, as well as northern Michigan, Macomb County, and Monroe County. The Michigan House of Representatives will have 28 new members in 2021, for a turnover of 25%. Current House Democratic Leader Christine Greig is Term-Limited and will not be returning next term. Rep. Donna Lasinski (D-Scio Tvp.) is expected to become the new Democratic leader. Current Speaker of the House Lee Chaffield (R-Levering) is Term-Limited and will not be returning as well. Rep. Jason Wentworth (R-Clare) is expected to assume that post in 2021.

3rd District **Shri Thanedar**(D-Detroit)



Thanedar is a prime example of the "American Dream". After gaining U.S. citizenship in 1988, Thanedar purchased a small business in 1990 comprised of three employees. Today, that company employs 450 people and is a pharmaceutical and international chemical research conglomerate. He sold the company prior to unsuccessfully running for Governor in 2018 receiving 17% of the primary vote.

Thanedar holds a PhD from the University of Akron, and a Master of Science in Chemistry from the University of Bombay.

Aiyash was born in Michigan and made history as the youngest member of the city commission in Hamtramck. He is the son of a UAW auto worker whose parents emigrated from Yemen. Aiyash was a district organizer for President Barack Obama's campaign in 2008. He co-founded a non-profit which advocates for early childhood literacy in the working-class communities of Flint and Detroit.

Aiyash holds a Bachelor of Arts in Political Theory & Constitutional Democracy from the College of James Madison at Michigan State University.

Prior to that role, Scott helped organize a unity coalition for the Southeast Michigan Jobs with Justice (SEMJwJ), comprised of 70 union labor and faith-based organizations. She helped organize multiple ballot initiatives and is well recognized within her community.

Scott holds a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Marygrove College.


Cavanagh is a graduate of Wayne State University.

College.








Bezotte holds a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice from Eastern Michigan University and completed the FBI National Academy at the University of Virginia.


After graduating high school, Martin enlisted in the United States Air Force where he later retired honorably as a Master Sergeant.






Outman received a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration & Management from Ferris State University.


